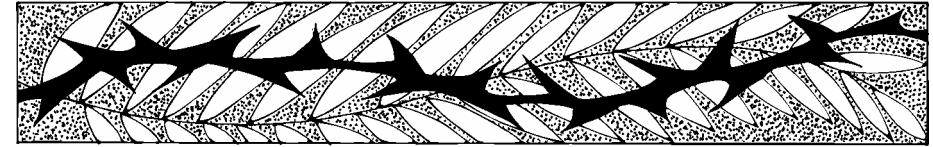

Camp Medley

Leader – in – Training

Maren McLean Persaud knows that leadership training for teenagers works. She points to herself as the proof.

"I didn't enjoy camp much. I was a quiet kid," she said.

But years later, when she was 16, she was invited to a Leader-in-Training camp program which had a great impact on her.

"It's the reason I'm still involved in camp. It set me off on a good foot," said the director of Camp Medley.
