nothing is hidden from its burning heat.**

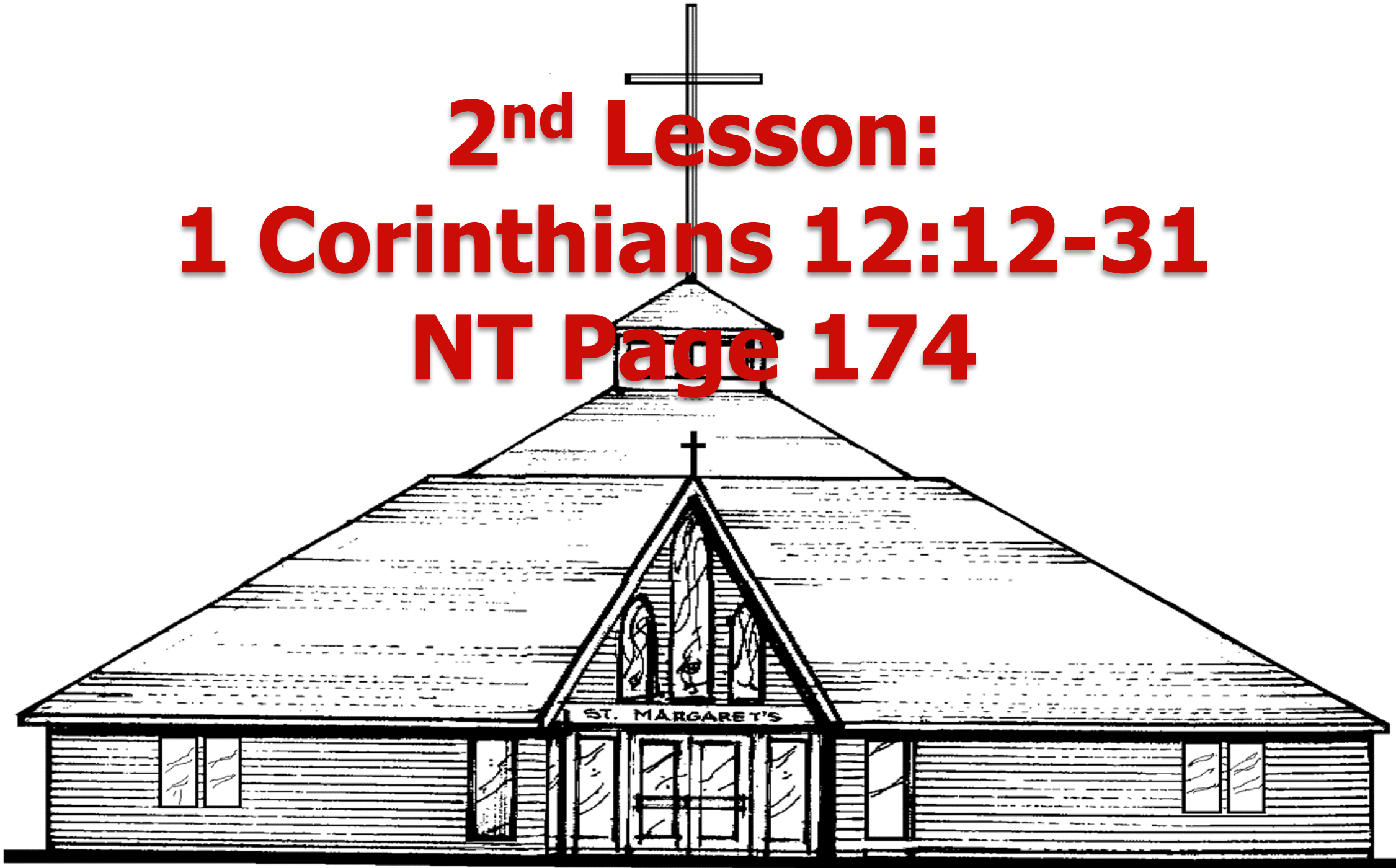
**The law of the Lord is perfect

O Lord, my strength and my redeemer.**

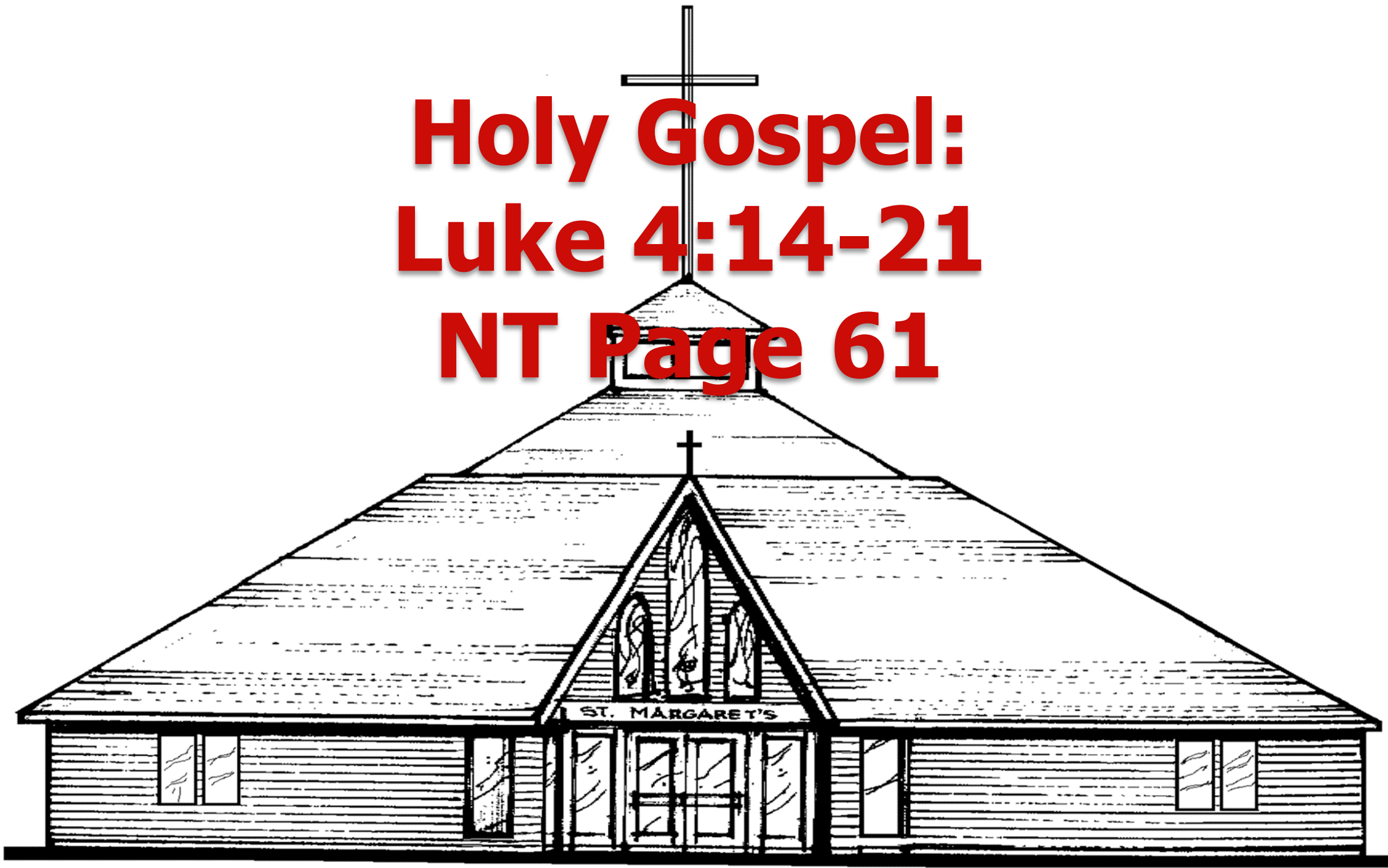

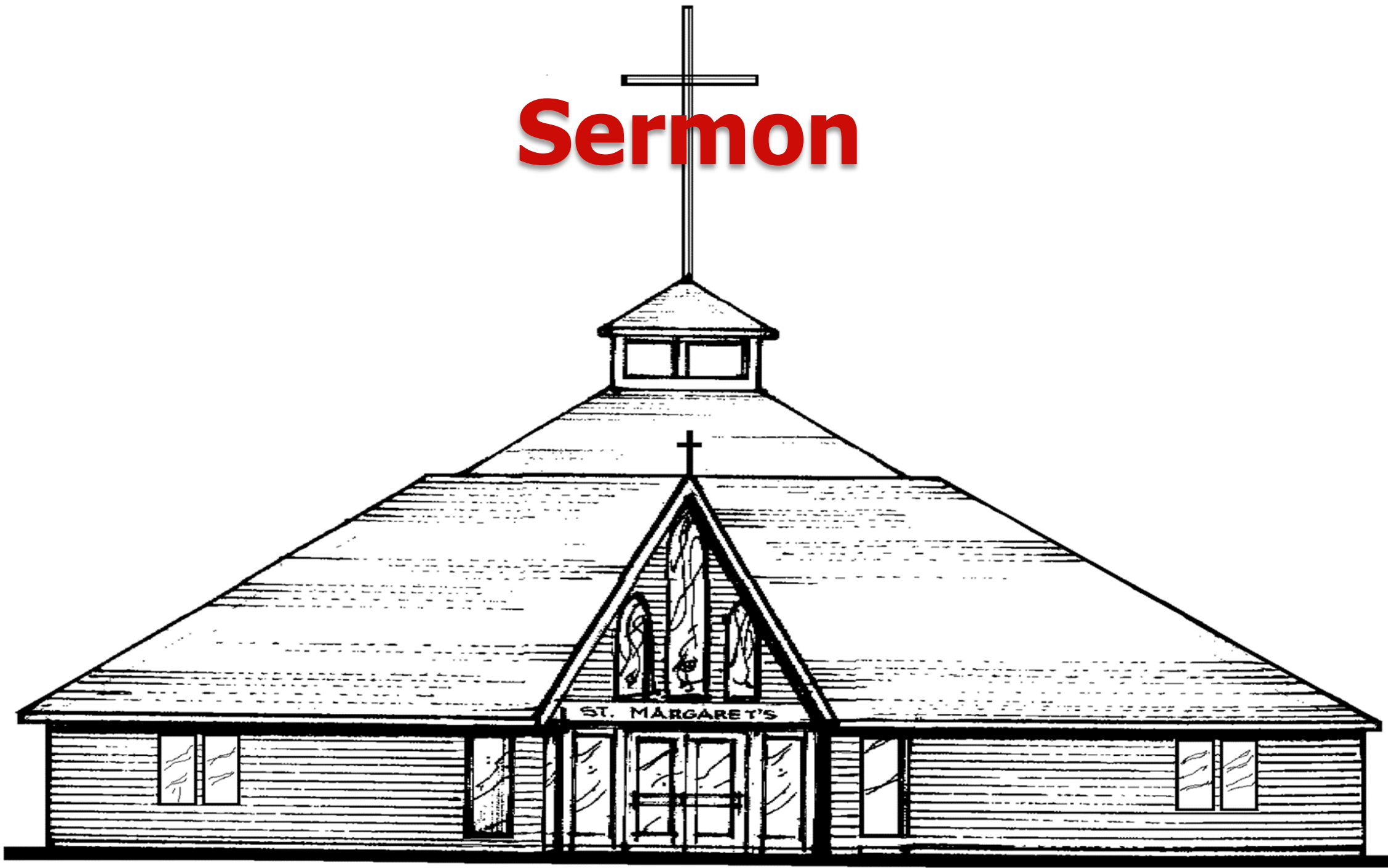
