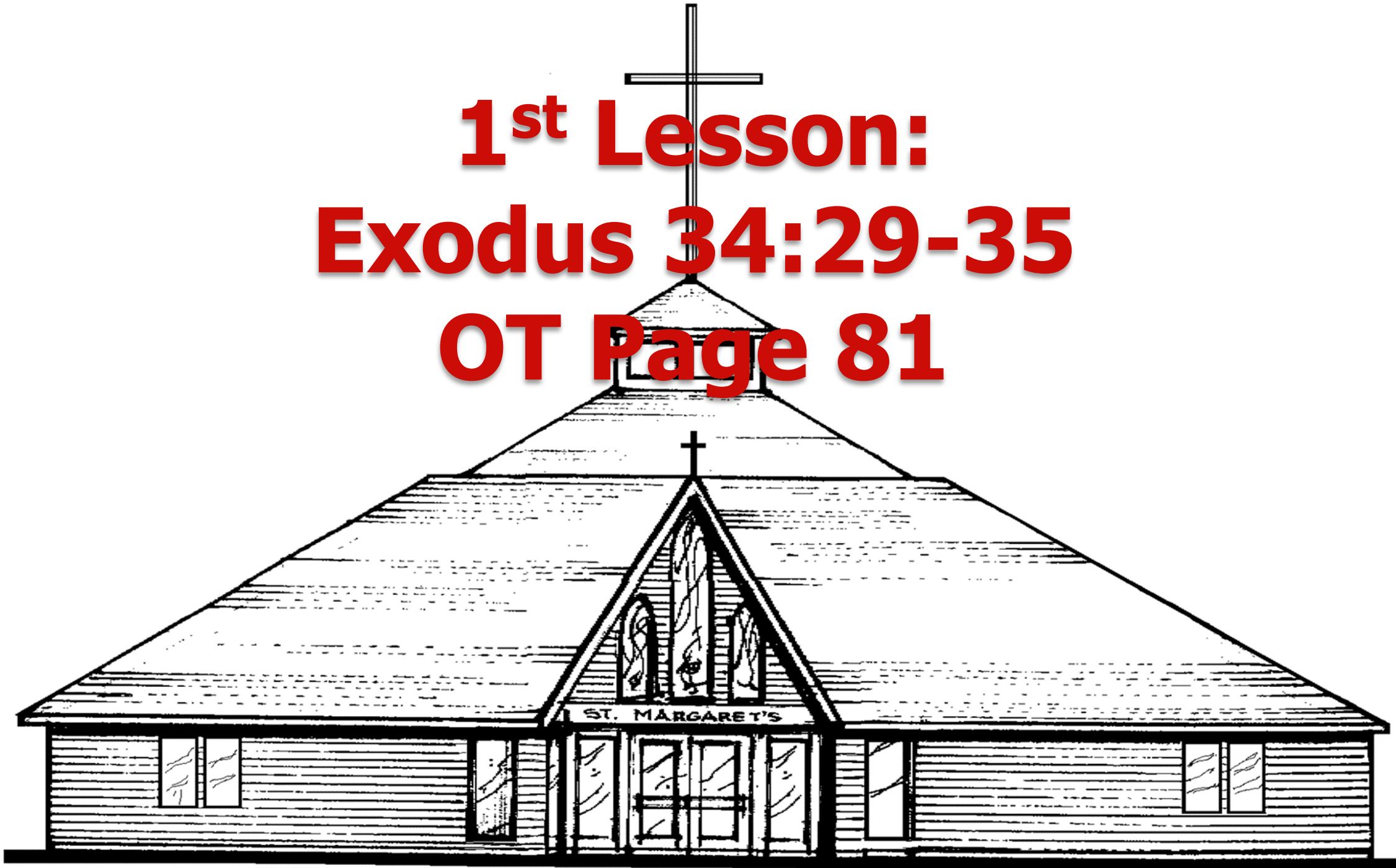

Proclaim the greatness of the Lord our God and fall down before his footstool; he is the Holy One.

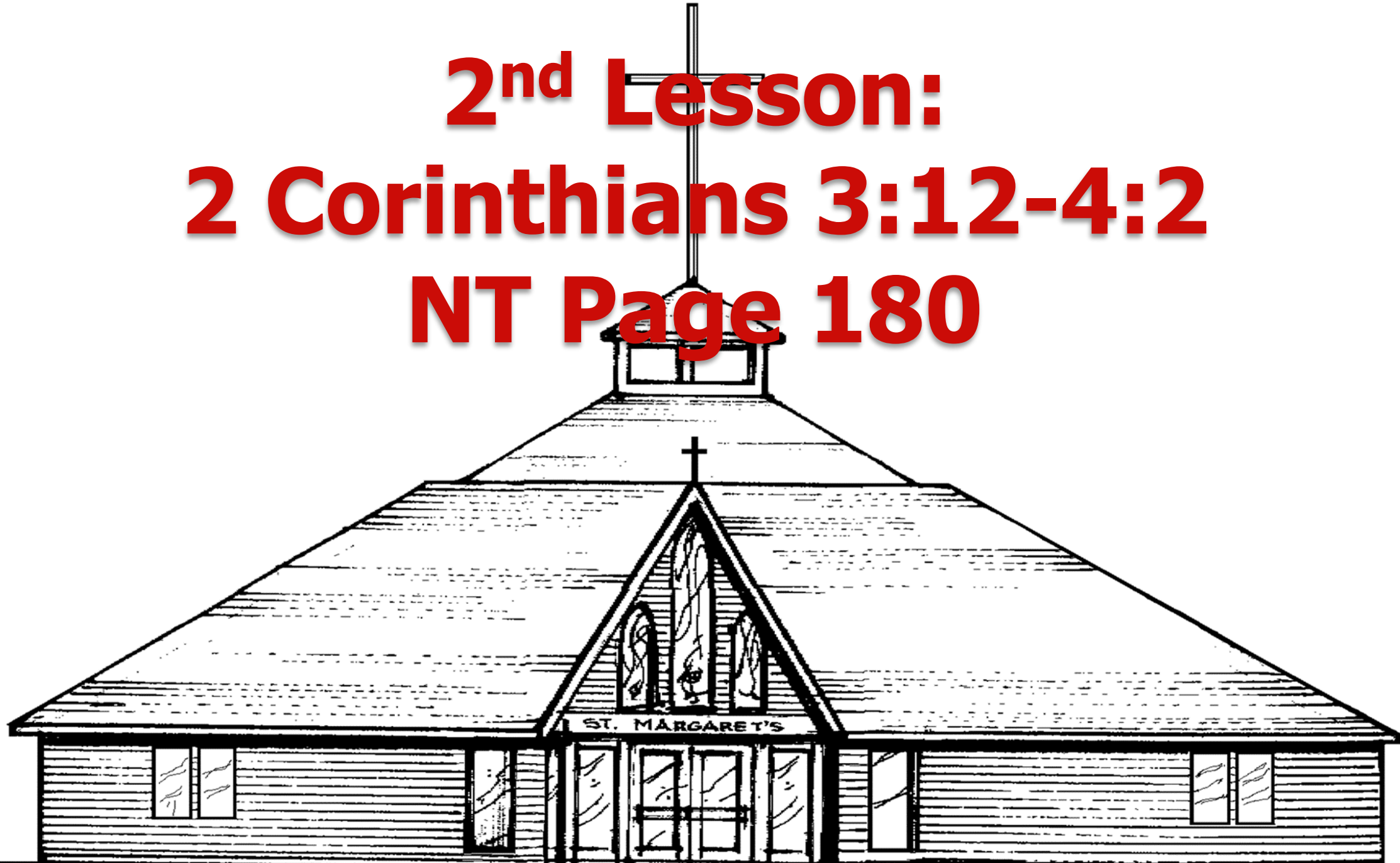

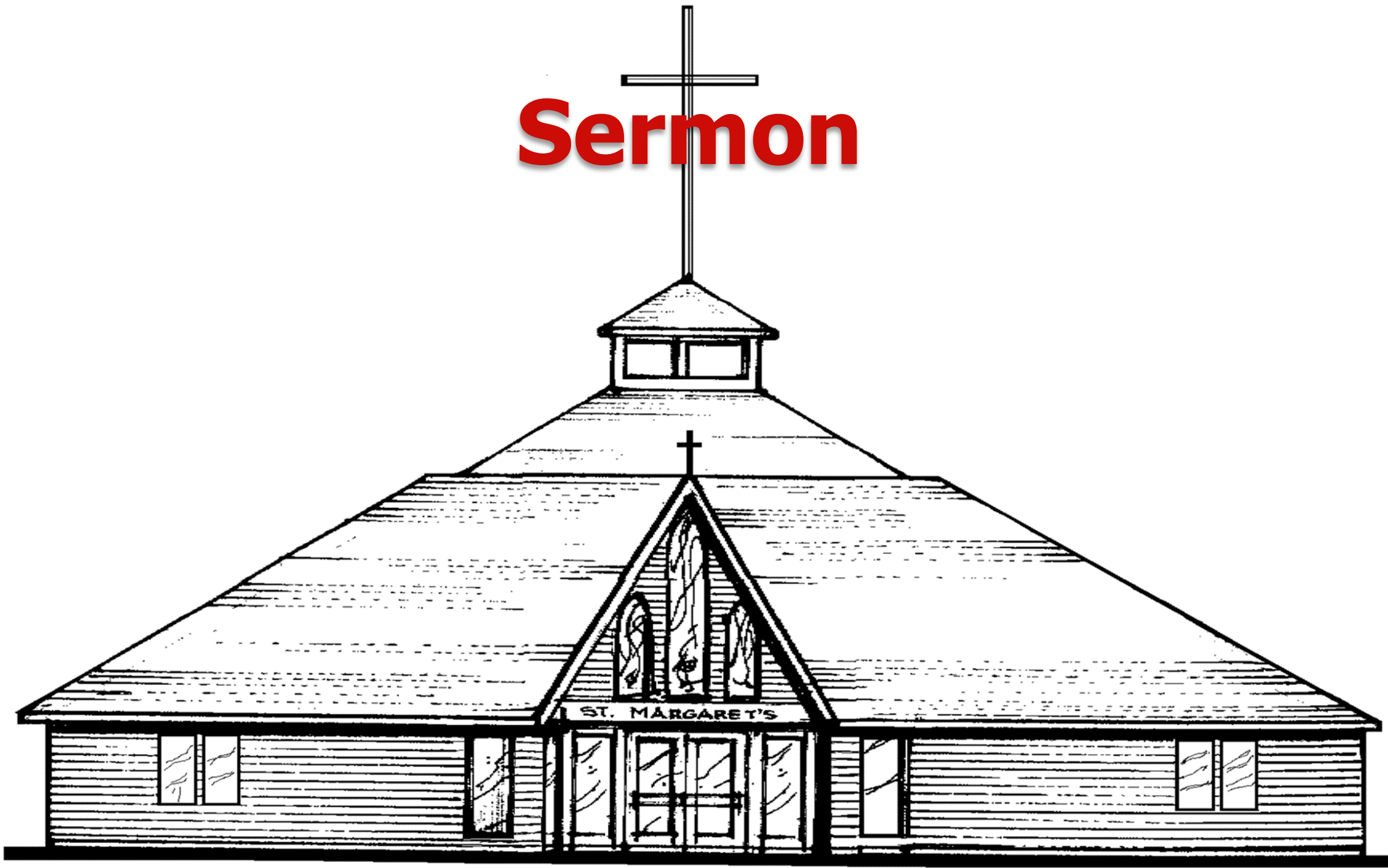
