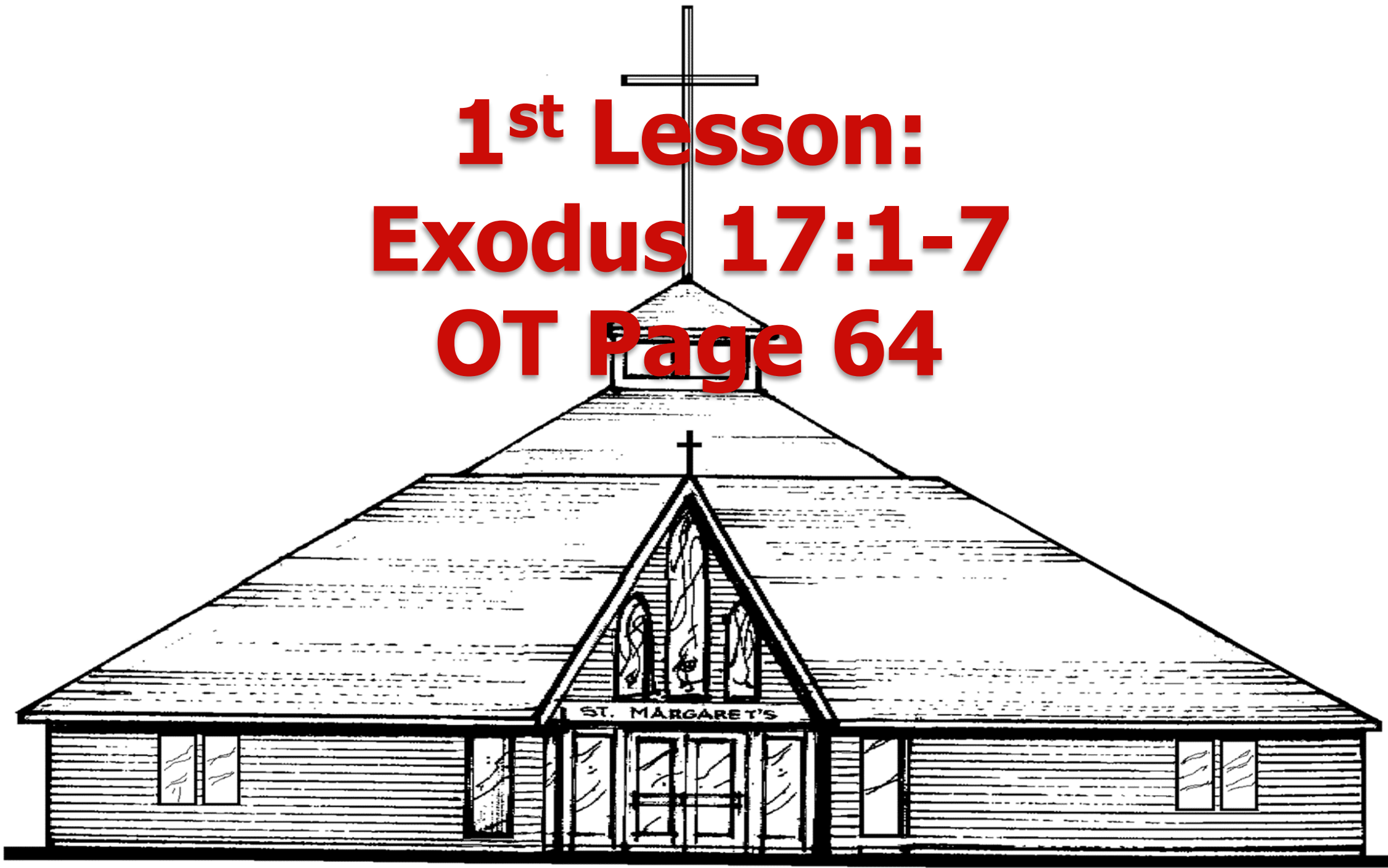

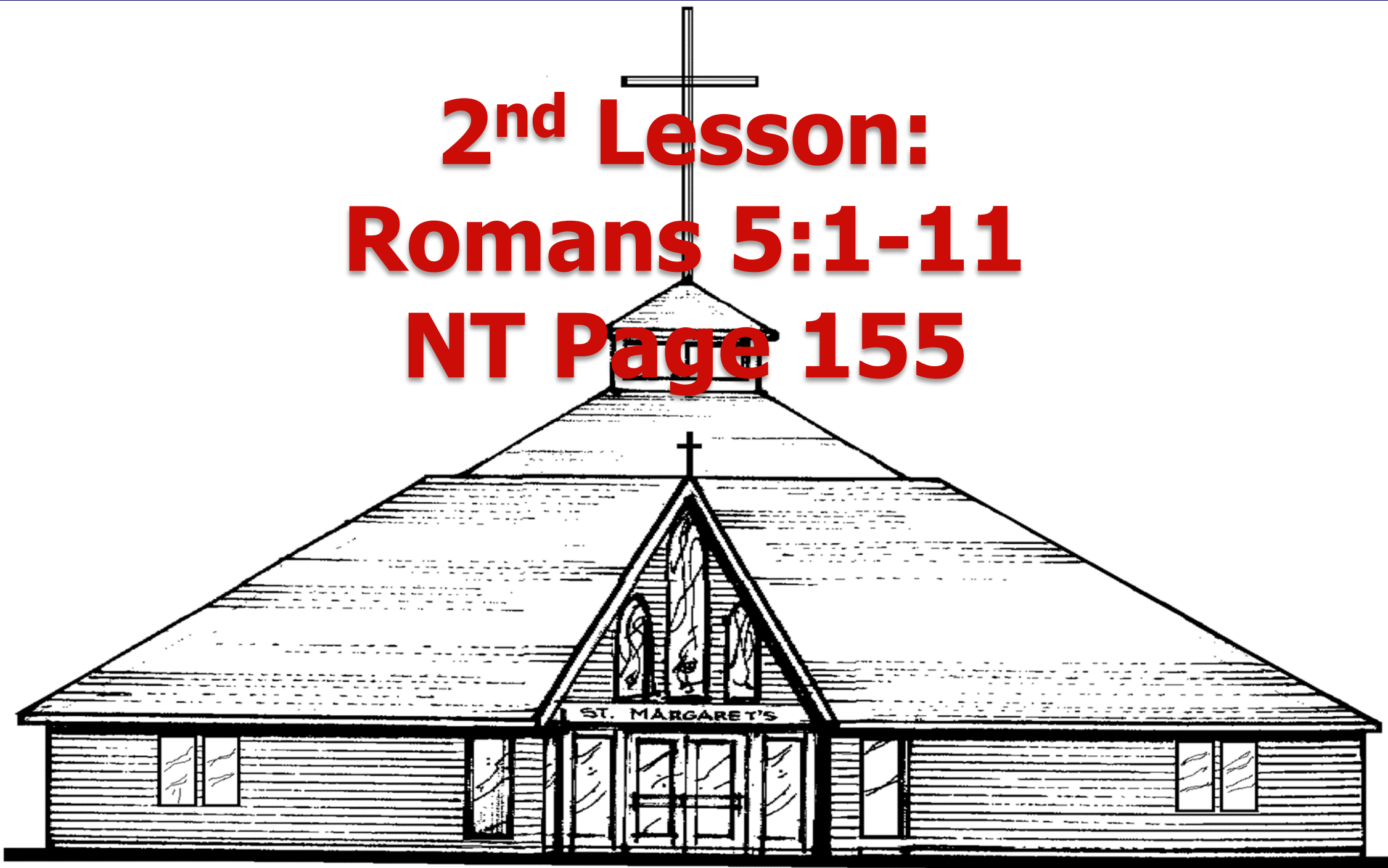

enter into my rest.”**

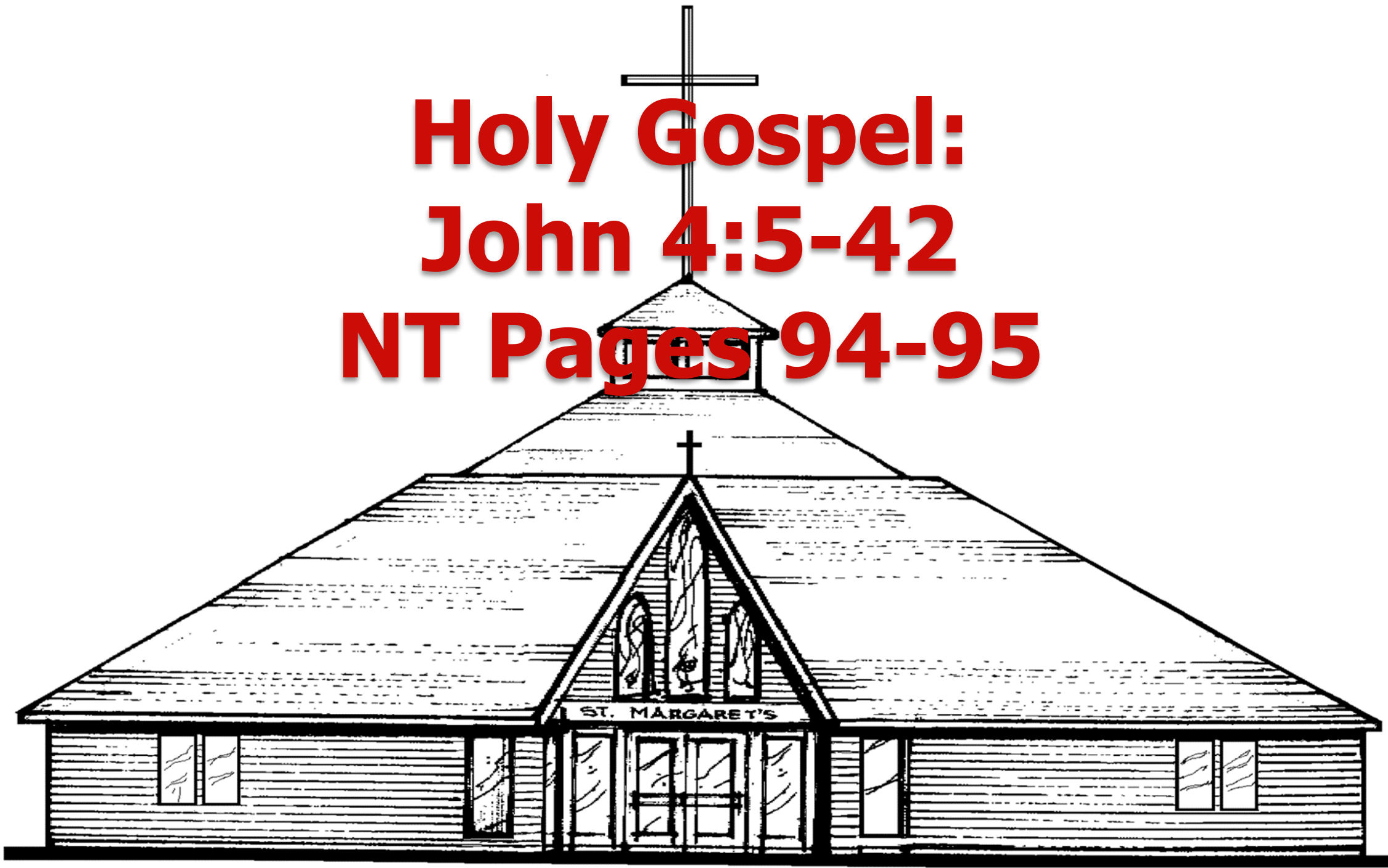

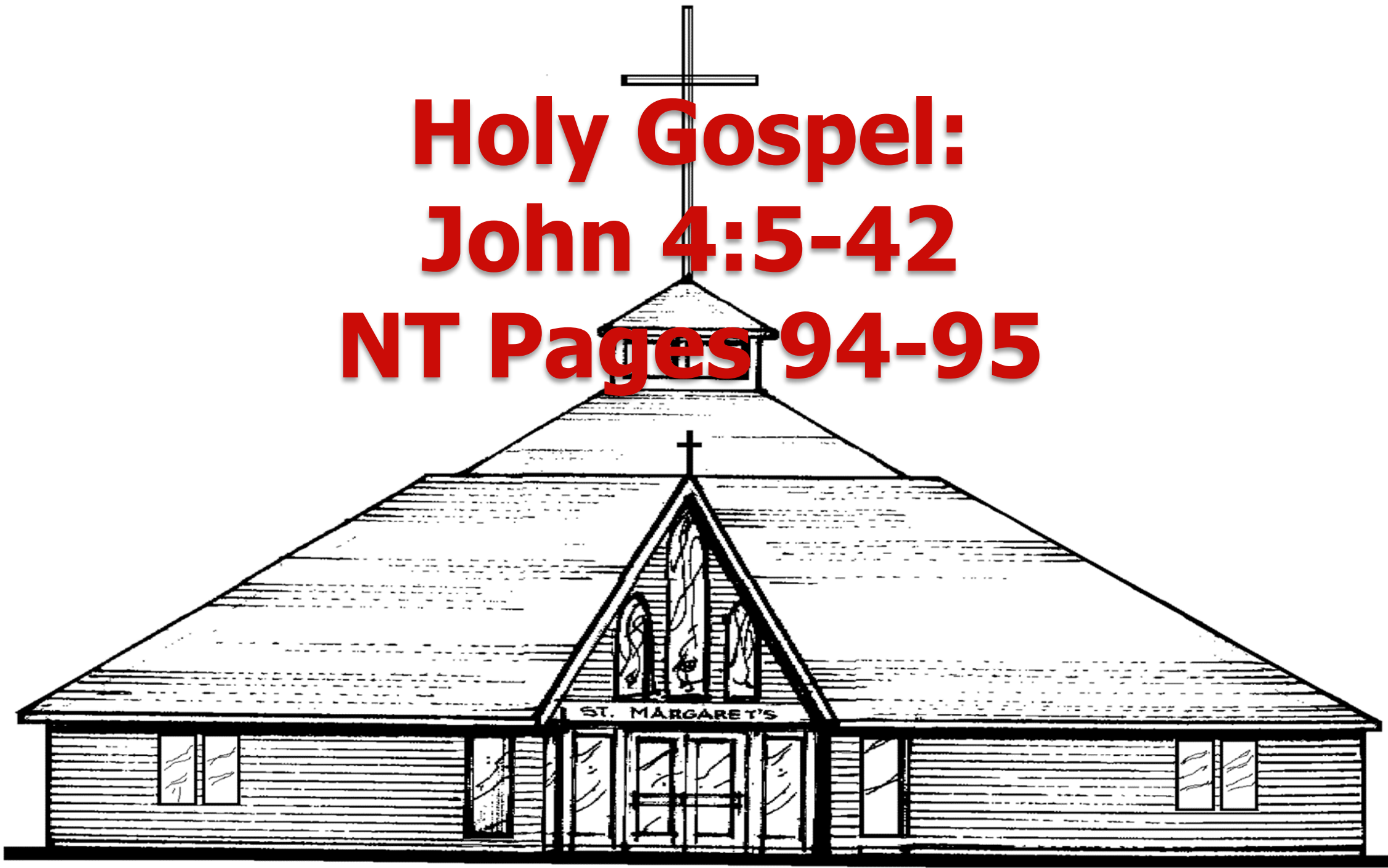
